

Art Unites EAST / WEST the World EAST / WEST

FOUNDATION FRISON HORTA «A living Museum»

"Art unites the world: East - West" takes place in a museum space in the center of Brussels in the Frison Horta Foundation house, built by the great Art Nouveau architect Victor Horta in 1894. The exhibition strives to be truly international, bringing together artists from India, China, Japan, Belgium, Spain, Italy, Germany, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Russia, and Armenia. The works of several great contemporary artists, such as Yuan Shun and Yuri Kuper, whose pieces are housed in some of the world's largest museums, are presented alongside the works of young artists such as Tanaya Rao from India and Dima Sukhov from Russia. The "Art Unites the World" project seeks to bring well deserved exposure to these talented young artists.

The organizers were inspired to undertake an exhibition under the East/West theme through the ideas of Nicholas Roerich. From his youth, he was fascinated by the cultural heritage of the East. Through its honouring and preservation of centuries old traditions, he saw more humane and harmonious principles demonstrated in Eastern artwork compared to those espoused in the West. In 1928, N.K. Roerich prepared a draft Treaty for the Protection of Cultural Property (the Roerich Pact) which was sent to the governments and peoples of all countries. The draft Pact was approved by the Committee on Museum Affairs of the League of Nations as well as the Pan-American Union. As a direct result of this, the World League of Culture was established in a number of countries, making Nicholas Roerich one of the first to truly unite countries through the promotion of ideas and the preservation of cultural heritage.

The great Lev Tolstoy is also connected with the East/West theme. Firstly, he is an author who has won the hearts of readers from all continents with his works, making his impact and reach truly global. Secondly, he was the first prominent cultural figure in Russia to voice the need for cultural and political cooperation with representatives of the East. He wrote articles on this topic, including "Letter to the Indian" and "Letter to the Chinese", and received delegations from Eastern countries, sharing his views with Mahatma Gandhi on the issue of combating racial discrimination.

Two photographic works by the Italian artist Enzo Rosamilia dedicated to N. Roerich and L. Tolstoy were created especially for the exhibition. He is fascinated by a wide range of aspects of Russian literature and culture.

Chinese artist Yuan Shun presents at the exhibition a work from his "Line of Gravity" series. The work reflects his interest in abstract modern art, while also being influenced by medieval Chinese miniatures. He is included in the list of the most influential Chinese artists of the modern avant-garde movement. The artist is largely inspired by the 1980s, a generation defined by a period of rapidly growing global capitalism, political upheaval, and distinctive music and fashion, including electronic pop and hip-hop.

main role in preserving and prolonging peace belongs to women, and therefore the female population bears a huge responsibility for the future of the planet.

Two works by Belgian artist Philippe Leblanc represent the Fibonacci sequence, written in the ancient Mayan language and in Babylonian. Though different in culture, geographical areas, and time, they both express the famous mathematical sequence, one closely related to the golden ratio and often found in nature, from plants to entire galaxies.

The artist Ulan, a representative of the most ancient Kalmyk family, reflects in each of his works ideas borrowed from the philosophy of Buddhism. The exhibition presents his work dedicated to the creation of the world, the struggle between the elements of rationalism and chaos, the spiritual and the material.

Spanish artist Bernardo Aya counts among his most important projects EntreMuros, a very subtle reflection on the behaviour and environment of the Spanish-speaking aristocracy today. The exhibition presents his photographic work, which he shot in the interiors of the Frison Horta House with the participation of the owner, Mrs. Nupur Tron, and her daughter. These black and white photographs provide an opportunity to think about how family values and traditions can be maintained through the preservation of architecture and art.

The exhibition ends with the work of the Armenian artist Samvel Stepanyan, who despite living a short life and dying in 1996, entered the history of Armenian art. His works are housed to this day in some of the most important museums in Armenia. The painting presented at the exhibition was painted in 1992 in an abstract style. At this time, Armenia received freedom from the Soviet Union and was creating a new state from scratch, challenged with geopolitical and natural problems. The desire for freedom from socialist realism mobilized artists to create new art. Samvel moves away from realism towards non-objectivity and turns to the aesthetics of the distant past - rock paintings and encrypted pictograms. New art has become a symbol of the avant-garde in the history of art in Armenia and a new historical milestone in the development of the country.

The organizers are convinced that art is what unites the world and helps preserve culture and moral ideals for the sake of future generations.

Yuan Shun is a master of blending traditional Chinese ink painting with contemporary concepts, weaving intricate narratives that bridge the past and present.




About works

PHILIPPE LEBLANC Belgium

Philippe Leblanc lives and works in Brussels (Belgium)

An artist sensitive to rationality and the purity of forms, Philippe Leblanc finds inspiration in mathematics, in famous series like Fibonacci's, conical shapes and emblematic numbers such as the golden number, Pi, or root of two.




His creations of abstract appearance are based on the writing of numbering systems from distant cultures, which confers them a mysterious formal balance. He imagines time machines and calendars according to strict rules which then fade away to retain only their random and enigmatic character. His works include wall sculptures, light boxes, hanging mobiles, motorized carousels or raised puzzles, all sharing the same geometric language.

An architect-engineer by training, Philippe Leblanc exploits and expresses the paradoxes between rigor of concept and material constraint, underlying rules and apparent randomness, mathematical aridity and playful experiences, bringing forward his idea that art must both stimulate and soothe the mind.

About works


The two artworks show the Fibonacci series written in ancient Mayan or Babylonian: different cultures, different geographical zones, and different times, expressing the famous mathematical series intimately related to the golden ratio, found frequently across all of nature, from plants to galaxies. Babylonacci artworks uses a Babylonian sexagesimal (base 60) and positional numeral system to depict the Fibonacci sequence. Inherited by the ancient Sumerians in the 3rd millennium BC in Mesopotamia, the system was used until the 3rd century BC.

Two symbols – a vertical wedge, and a horizontal wedge, which equals ten vertical wedges — are used for all numbers, since their position confers a value. The symbols have been stylized into Isosceles right triangles with different sizes and orientations.
